

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

EASTER DUTY – After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time of the year. By special indult, in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this precept has been extended to include the period beginning the First Sunday of Lent (March 6, 2022) to Trinity Sunday (June 12, 2022).

Item 2

Thursday, May 26, is the Solemnity of the Ascension, a Holyday of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated on Wednesday evening, May 25 (Vigil Mass) at 7:30 PM. and on Thursday, May 26 at 9:00 AM. and 12:00 PM.

Holy Hour will take place as usual on that day at 1:00 PM.

Item 3

We are in the month of May, a month which is particularly dedicated to Our Blessed Mother. Please take the time to say the Rosary each day this month and ask Her for Her intercession in helping young men and women discern the call to the priesthood and consecrated life and, as Queen of Peace, for an end to the conflict in Ukraine. In addition, to the Rosary, we will pray the Litany of Loreto during our Holy Hour each Thursday during the month of May.

Item 4

Please remember the young men and women of Sacred Heart Catholic Academy and Sacred Heart School of Religious Education who will receive Confirmation on **Tuesday, June 21**. The Most Reverend Nicholas DiMarzio, Ph.D.,

D.D., Bishop Emeritus of Brooklyn, will administer the Sacrament to our young people.

Item 5

The work on replacing the air conditioning system in the church has begun! We have received all the necessary permits from the DOB. As I had mentioned awhile back the cost will be \$240,000. Now the arduous work of raising the funds necessary begins for **YOU** and **ME together**. I had to give a down payment of one half the cost- \$117,900 – to the company on March 17 and just received a bill for half of the next installment- \$ 58,900 due this week. We will have to replace this money which I have taken from our parish reserves and collect the necessary funds to cover the cost of the entire project. It is hoped that this will be completed before the extremely hot weather arrives in June.

If you would like to make a contribution to this project, please place your gift in an envelope and mark it **AIR CONDITIONING** and print your name and envelope number (if you know it) on the envelope. Thus far 51 parishioners have donated \$40,945.00 for the project. Last summer when the air conditioner failed a few parishioners gave me money toward the eventual repair which totaled \$8,160.00 and when we were vandalized a number of parishioners gave me money toward a security system which totaled \$8,100.00; therefore, in total we have \$57,205.00 toward the \$300,000.00 project cost. (new a/c- parking lot fence-security system.)

Item 6

Someone wrote and asked why I am asking for money for the air conditioning/security system/fence project when we have \$700,000 in Generations of Faith money. When the Generations campaign started a number of projects were submitted to the Bishop by my predecessor and his committee. These projects were approved

by the Bishop and Generations monies is earmarked for these projects. When one of these projects is complete and the pastor receives the bill, he submits it to the Generations office, and they pay the contractor. The pastor does not just receive periodic checks from the Generations Office to do with as he wishes or sees fit. I hope this answers the question of the person who wrote seeking this information. I could not respond to them personally since they did not sign their name nor provide a return address in their note to me. Also, please remember that circumstances changed from when the campaign first started -- Some people who made pledges have died and therefore never fulfilled their pledge. Others who made pledges have moved away and have left no forwarding address and even after a thorough search we have not been able to locate them. Still others made a pledge in good faith but then their personal circumstances in life changed and they were unable to fulfill the pledge they once made. So, what the parish was expecting to receive will /may not be the same as when the campaign started, and the projected numbers/amounts were released.

The bathrooms in the church hall and painting the church are the next two Generations projects. Bids were being sought and submitted just as COVID hit and sent the world into lockdown. I intended to begin them again when things started to open up last Fall but then the air conditioning system in the church literally died and shut down at the end of August and I began to consult with the Diocesan Buildings Office about replacing the system before this summer and its heat arrives. Now that the air conditioning system is being installed, and the fence and security system (necessitated by the vandalism we

experienced just before the Covid lockdown) projects are in the works I am picking up these two Generations projects.

Item 7

Our ACA 2022 has begun! If you have not participated in the ACA in the past, I ask you to consider participating in the 2022 ACA; we have been given a goal of adding **60 new contributors** to the ACA this year. Our goal is the same as last year- \$91,954.00. As of **May 16**, we have **\$94,130.00 pledged (which puts us over goal in pledges)** and **\$83,019.56 paid in full**. 117 generous donors have already participated in this year's ACA. We are again grateful to the parishioner who contributed **\$30,000 to the ACA and paid the pledge in full**. If we did not have this generous gift, we would have difficulty in reaching our goal each year. I ask every parishioner to pledge something to this diocesan endeavor; **none of these monies are used for any other purpose other than what is listed in the information brochures, i.e., training of seminarians, support for senior priests, hospital ministry, etc.** All monies collected over goal come back to the parish in full. Thanks to all who have so generously given/pledged to this year's ACA. May God reward you for your generosity.



Take Jesus Literally

This Week's Readings at Mass

- Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 - Letter of the apostles to the gentiles
- Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23 - The new Jerusalem
- John 14:23-29 - Last discourse; faithfulness to God's word

There are two main parts in the Gospel passage today. In the first, Jesus continues emphasizing what we heard last week—that if we love him, we will act like him. It is a challenging reminder that we need to back up our words with our behavior and actions. It is not enough to “talk the talk;” we also need to “walk the walk.”

The second part is meant to be consoling to the apostles who know they are about to lose their leader after the Last Supper. Jesus understands the apostles are afraid and will feel lost once he is gone. Thankfully, the passage offers consolation for us when we feel afraid, lost, or unsure of what to do or say.

The promise of the Holy Spirit is followed by “Peace I leave with you;

my peace

I give

to you”


which

is then

followed by

“Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid.”

Jesus isn't promising that everything will be easy and smooth for the apostles after he leaves them. He doesn't promise them that they won't struggle just because they have the presence of the Holy Spirit within them. What he promises is that they can face their struggles with the assurance of God's ongo-



