FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

Bishop Brennan has assigned DEACON TOBECHUKWU OFFIAH a transitional deacon, who was ordained last Saturday, November 4, at St. Joseph's Seminary, Yonkers to our parish. Deacon Tobe begins his assignment this weekend. Deacon Tobe will be with us from Friday evening/Saturday evening until Sunday evening; he will stay in the rectory and share rectory life with Fr. Kieran and myself. Deacon Tobe's family are members of St. Clement Pope Parish in South Ozone Park.

Transitional Deacons are those deacons that are preparing to be ordained to the Priesthood. Deacon Offiah will be ordained, please God, a priest of our Diocese in June 2024. Deacons can preside at Baptisms, officiate at weddings, preach during Mass, officiate at Holy Hours/Benediction, distribute Holy Communion at Mass, take Communion to the homebound, bless objects and people, conduct wake services and burial/graveside services. Deacon "Tobe" will be with us until April 21, 2024. WELCOME to our parish family. We are so happy to have you among us and look forward to your ministry here at Sacred Heart.

November is the MONTH of the HOLY SOULS in PURGATORY, and we are invited to pray for all our deceased friends and relatives. As we are reminded in the Scriptures: "It is a good and pious thing to pray for the dead." Remember the offering of Mass for a deceased person and praying for them are two means to help a soul in Purgatory. Let us remember that one day we might be where they are now and will be hoping that someone's prayers will assist us.

The above permission, which appeared in 1973, lies behind a phenomenon which has emerged in many Catholic parishes over the past few years, namely the celebration of a separate **Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)** during Sunday mass.

Are We Awake?

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Wisdom 6:12-16 • Wisdom for those who seek
- ▶ 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 • Resurrection of the dead
- ▶ Matthew 25:1-13 • Parable of the ten virgins

The wedding customs of Jesus' time may be unfamiliar to us, but the point of the parable today isn't the details about how wedding ceremonies worked. The parable focuses on Jesus' teaching to remain alert and vigilant as we await the full coming of the Kingdom of Heaven.

There is debate about whether this parable points to our need to be watchful for Jesus' second coming at the end of time or is making another point. We know from other New Testament writings that St. Paul, Jesus' other apostles, and the whole early Christian community expected Jesus to return in their lifetime. The second reading today gives us Paul's version of how he imagined this happening. "The Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven..." (Thess. 4:16). The early Christians understood this parable as the need for vigilance for the end of the world,

Perhaps that isn't the meaning of it for us today, however. Assuming Jesus doesn't return in our lifetimes, what might he be urging us to prepare for? What are we called to stay awake to? Many of Jesus' teachings focused on the Kingdom of God, which he repeatedly said "is at hand." Perhaps that is the invitation to us—to be alert to how the Kingdom of God is breaking into our world today, right where we find ourselves. As we near the end of a

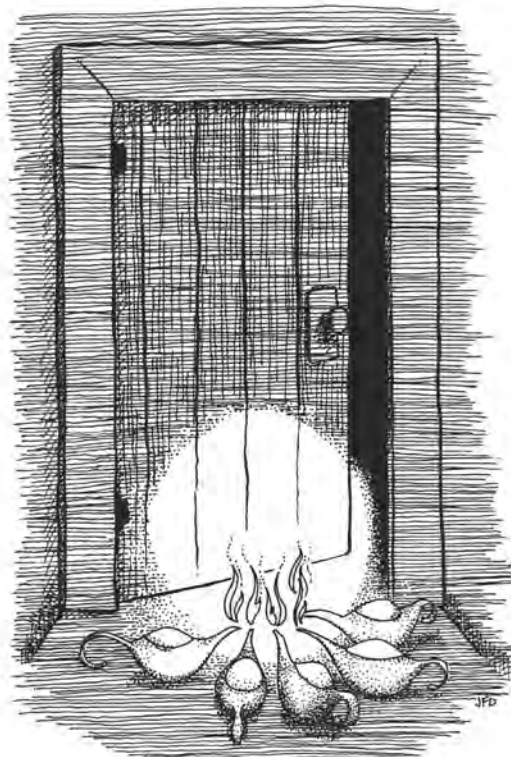


tumultuous 2023, we may be challenged to see how God is active in the world right now. Yet Jesus, too, lived in a world racked by racial and economic injustice, military domination, and sickness and suffering, yet he still saw ways God was active and working. Can we?

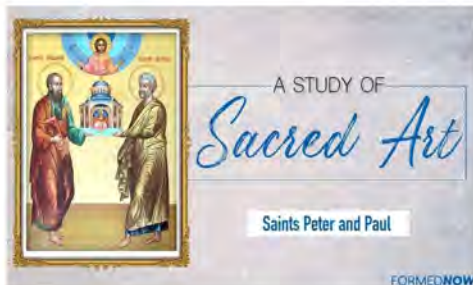
