

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

On this last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year, on this Solemnity of Christ the King let us entrust our families, homes, city, nation, world, and hearts to Christ the King and ask Him to rule over us. The Cristeros (who were fighting anti-Catholic and secularists agendas in the early twentieth century in Mexico) lived the battle cry: ¡VIVA CRISTO REY!- LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING! MAY THAT BE OUR MANTRA IN LIFE TODAY ON THIS FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING AND CONTINUE ALL THE DAYS OF OUR LIVES.

Item 2

IF YOU WERE NOT ABLE TO ATTEND MASS ON THANKSGIVING DAY, WE ASK THAT YOU PLACE YOUR THANKSGIVING GIFT TO THE CHURCH ENEVELOPE IN THE COLLECTION TODAY OR NEXT SUNDAY. THANK YOU IN ADVANCE FOR YOUR GENEROUS GIFT TO YOUR CHURCH AS WE **CELEBRATE** THANKSGIVING AND COUNT THE WAYS THAT **GOD HAS BLESSED US! THESE GIFTS WILL** HELP US PAY SOME UNEXPECTED REPAIRS **AROSE** THE **WEEK** THAT **BEFORE** THANKSGIVING- REPLACING THE HOT WATER HEATER IN THE RECTORY, REPAIRING THE MICROPHONES IN THE CHURCH, REPLACING A PRINTER IN THE RECTORY OFFICE TO NAME A FEW.

Item 3

The second collection taken this weekend of NOVEMBER 25-26 is for the CHRISTMAS NOVENA of MASSES. You may enroll both the living and deceased family and friends in the **Christmas Novena. All the Masses of Christmas** and the octave of Christmas will be offered for the names submitted to us on the envelopes. Envelopes for this purpose are in your envelope packet and are also available around the Church. The envelopes with the names of those who will be enrolled in the Christmas Novena will be placed in a basket near the altar.

Item 4

The second collection of the weekend of December2-3 will be for Christmas Flowers and Decoration- for both inside and outside the church and church property. As in the past years those who donate \$30 or more will have their names and for in whose intention/name the donation was made printed in a special insert in the bulletin after Christmas. Everyone always compliments the beauty of our church at Christmas, but we must remember that it does entail a cost to keep the church and church property looking festive for Christmas. Please be as generous as you can in this collection. Last year just the outside decorations- to put them up, take them down and have the company keep them in storage cost more than \$4,000.

Item 5

I thought I'd share this popular tradition with you as we approach the holy season Advent.

On the feast of Sr. Andrew, November 30th there is a custom that involves praying the Christmas Novena. It is piously believed that whoever recites the St. Andrew Christmas novena prayer FIFTEEN times each day from the feast of St. Andrew (November 30th) until Christmas Eve will obtain the favor requested. Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born Of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother.

Item 6

After the new year, work will begin on painting the inside of the church and refinishing the pews and fixing the kneelers which are part of our Generations of Faith projects. The various steps of permission and approval have been initiated with the Diocese and the final stamp of approval should be granted shortly.

Item 7

We will also have a shrine built to Blessed Carlo Acutis inside the church where his relic will be kept. If you recall Bishop DiMarzio stated that our parish would be the Diocesan Shrine of Blessed Carlo and when I spoke with Bishop Brennan he confirmed the plans that Bishop DiMarzio initiated before his retirement. The shrine is being paid for by a parishioner who wishes to remain anonymous. The statue of Blessed Carlo was ordered this past week.


