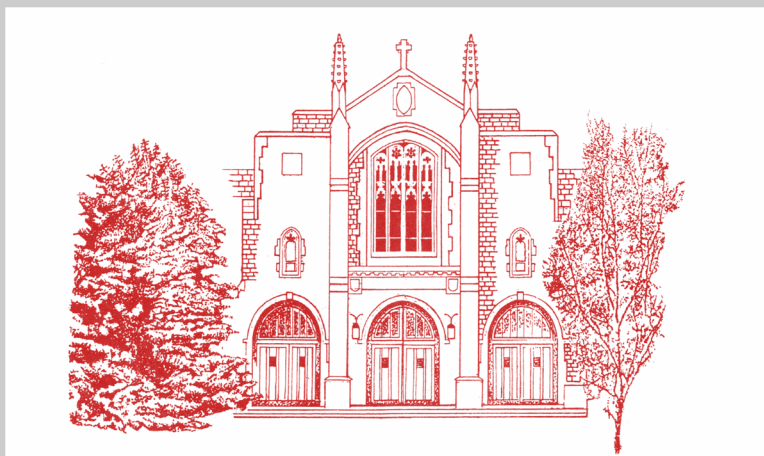

December 16- Simbang Gabi begins-- **Simbang Gabi is a devotional, nine-day series of Masses attended by Filipino Catholics in anticipation of Christmas.**

Las Posadas begins- celebrated in Latin American countries between December 16 & 24 that commemorates the journey of Mary and Joseph before the birth of Jesus.

Las Parrandas begins- The festival began in the 18th century when Father Francisco Vigil de Quiñones, who just so happened to be the priest of the Grand Cathedral of Remedios, was disappointed with the turnout for Midnight Mass. He gathered all the children from the village and provided them with jars, pans and wooden spoons – the louder the utensil, the better. He implored the children to run around the streets making as much noise as possible. His goal was to encourage adults to attend the Midnight Masses the week before Christmas. Over the years, the tradition has grown and developed into the massive street party it has become today. Now, in the days before Christmas, Cuba erupts into an eclectic celebration of lights, lively gatherings and carnival inspired performances... Imagine conga groups, rumba dancing, decadent and colorful floats, bright lights and of course, one of the most explosive and creative fireworks displays. *"Sometimes, moreover, if the place itself and the nature of the community permit, it will be appropriate to celebrate the **Liturgy of the Word**, including a homily, with the children in a separate, but not too distant room. Then, before the **Eucharistic Liturgy** begins, the children are led to the place where the adults have meanwhile celebrated their own liturgy of the word."*

The above permission, which appeared in 1973, lies behind a phenomenon which has emerged in many Catholic parishes over the past few years, namely the celebration of a separate **Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)** during Sunday mass.

## A Long Road Ahead

*This Week's Readings at Mass*

- ▶ Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 - Promise of salvation
- ▶ 2 Peter 3:8-14 - Christ will come in judgment
- ▶ Mark 1:1-8 - John the Baptist

In the First Reading, the prophet Isaiah addressed the Jewish people, who were captives in Babylon. It was a time of great darkness in the history of our Jewish ancestors. Their country had been conquered, and their people were captured and taken away to a foreign land. Isaiah was speaking to people who knew what hopelessness felt like, people who understood personal and national darkness and despair. They didn't know if their nation would survive the conquest or if they would ever see their homeland again. Home was 500 miles across the wilderness as the crow flies, but a 900 mile trek because of the terrain.

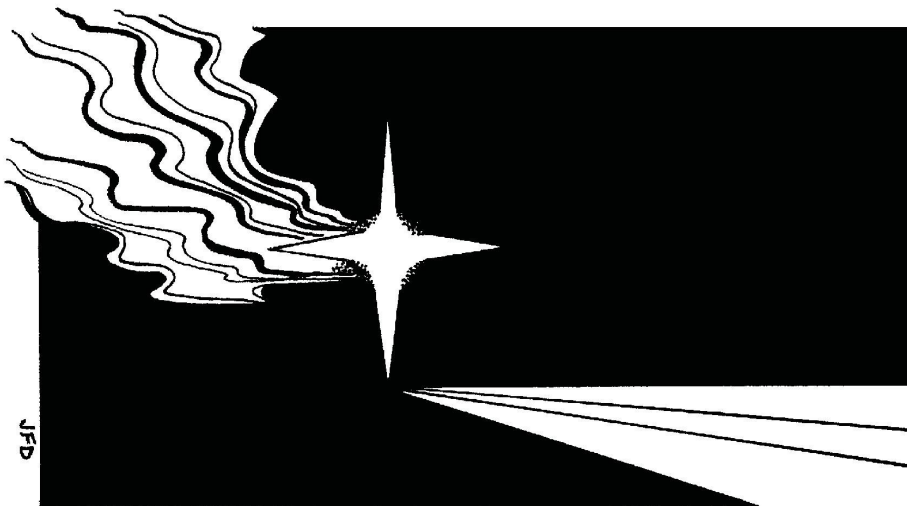
Isaiah proclaimed words of comfort, and promised that their ordeal was about to end. He knew the journey back home would be long and hard. The people would have mountains to climb and valleys to cross as they passed through the rugged landscape, but Isaiah promised that God would be with them to smooth the way. He assured them that their God was coming with power, and like a shepherd, would feed his flock and lead them with care.

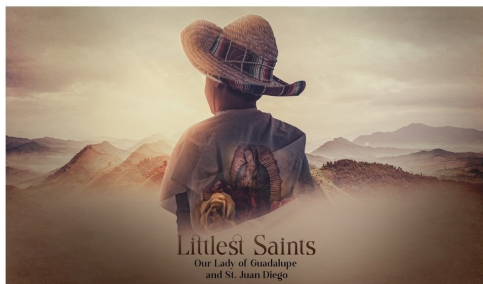
