

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

Fr. Kieran, and I would like to thank you for the cards, fruit and food baskets, cakes and cookies, wine and candy, gift cards and monetary gifts that you have given to us on Christmas. It means a lot to both of us since Fr. Kieran's family is in Nigeria and he is far from them, and all my immediate family has gone home to the Lord; you made us feel like we are part of your families. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts. May God bless you for your goodness and generosity! May you and yours have a blessed, happy and holy New Year - 2024!

Item 2



When I was growing up it was a tradition, as it is until this day in all the Polish parishes, for the priests of the parish to visit all the homes in the parish beginning on Epiphany and bless each home marking the door post -20+K +M+B+24 the first two numbers of the year followed by the initial of each of the Kings-KASPAR-MELCHOIR BALTHASAR- followed by the last two numbers of the year. (I did this for many years when I was assigned in Polish parishes; in my first parish in Greenpoint it would take myself and the other curate (the old name for parochial vicar) 6 weeks to visit all the homes in the parish. We would go out from 9:00 AM-9:00 PM- Monday-Friday). In recent years, the custom has become more widespread, and many parishes now provide the prayers and blessed chalk to their parishioners so that they may bless their homes at the beginning of the New year and ask God to "visit" their home just as the Magi visited the Christ Child and to also ask His protection in the new year. Small packets that I purchased from Poland with a small piece of charcoal, some incense and a piece of chalk along with a prayer aide with two different blessing prayers are available for you to use at home are located on the table near the lectern. Please- ONE PACKET per FAMILY.

Item 3

Tuesday is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It is unusual for this feast to fall on a Tuesday, but it happens due to the celebration of Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary on Mondays this liturgical year.

It is a "strange" feast in that people always ask: Why did Jesus need to be baptized? Msgr. Joseph Prior answered that questioned in his column in the diocesan paper of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and gave the following answer:

"Why was Jesus baptized? It's a simple question that many people ask. The thought basically goes like this: if baptism is for the forgiveness of sin and Jesus has no sin why did he need to be baptized?"

"The simple answer is that Jesus did not need to be baptized; rather, he wanted to be baptized. He chose to be baptized not because he had sin that would need to be forgiven but rather to further embrace the human condition that begs for forgiveness and healing.... The simple but profound answer is that he loves us and wants us to share in his divine life."

Today would be a good day to celebrate your Baptism. Do you know the date of your Baptism? If not, find it out. We celebrate our birthdays with great fanfare do we not? Should we not also celebrate our birth into God's family, the Church, and being washed clean of original sin with the same, (if not more) fanfare?

Item 4

RETURN of GROUP BAPTISMS-- Beginning in January 2024 Baptisms will be celebrated twice a month- at 12 P.M. on the Second Saturday and at 2:00 P.M. on the Third Sunday of each month. The celebration of the sacraments is an act of the Church; it is never a private celebration. Many people call and request a "private Baptism" which is an oxymoron- no sacrament can ever be private. What they really want is for their child to be baptized by itself and not in a group setting. A Baptism of an individual child is always a rare exception and never the norm; in fact, the ritual really foresees Baptisms to take place during Sunday Mass as the norm and not in a ceremony outside of Mass, which would be an exception. However, the custom of

which would be an exception. However, the custom of the Baptism ceremony outside of Mass had taken root in our country.

We provided the "private" option during COVID and well beyond its lifting, much longer than many other parishes, to help people feel at ease. But now we will return to the pre-COVID days of Baptisms in a group setting.

Each day, the numbers of our clergy here in the Diocese and throughout the Western world decreases. As our numbers decrease, as we take on the responsibility of more than one parish or iob, and as we advance in age we must balance all of our ministerial responsibilities while at the same time taking care of our health. There just are not enough of us to continue in a business-as-usual mode. All of these factors must be taken into consideration as well. Therefore, we will celebrate Baptisms once again, as we did pre-COVID, in a group setting starting in WE ARE OVER GOAL! January 2024.

Item 5

2024 marks 350th Anniversary of the Revelations of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. I am in the process of planning a special celebration/concert for our parish to mark this occasion. Details will be shared with you as the plans become more solidified.


This Week's Readings at Mass

The Feast of the Epiphany brings the Christmas season to a close as the Magi visit the infant Jesus. "Epiphany" is a Greek word meaning a "showing" or "manifestation." In this context it refers to the public recognition of Jesus as the newborn king of the Jews.

Not much is known about the Magi: their names, their country of origin, or even how many there were is never mentioned in the Bible. So who were they? In Jesus' time, the term Magi referred to a caste of Persian priests. They were astrologers who looked to the stars as guides. We don't know their place of origin, except that it was from somewhere east of the Holy Land, perhaps Arabia or the Syrian desert because of the gifts they brought.

Whoever they were, the mysterious people who came to worship Jesus were pagan foreigners. They would have been well-educated and wealthy. They were also seekers, willing to give up the comforts of their daily lives for a long journey to an unknown destination. They were courageous enough to seek an audience with the feared tyrant, King Herod. Clearly, something very powerful was drawing them, and they trusted that they were being led. Later, they trusted their dreams that they should



were changed by the baby and the Holy Family they met.
