

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

Item 3

As we continue to celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (January 18-25) we pray in the words of the Official Prayer Text for this year's celebration:

We pray, O gracious Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, that we all may be one as you are one. In your community of complete unity, we have our beginning and our end. To you we pray, asking for the gift of visible unity among all who believe in your Christ.

As we commemorate this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, we are reminded by your Word that all human beings are our neighbors and that we are to love them like ourselves and in the same way we love you. Help us to overcome the barriers and divisions we have nurtured against your will.

Grant to us, O Lord, a new Spirit of love and solidarity, that we may proclaim your good news to all of creation. We ask this through your Son, Jesus Christ, who with you and the Holy Spirt are one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Item 4

RETURN of GROUP BAPTISMS-- Beginning in January 2024 Baptisms will be celebrated twice a month- at 12 P.M. on the Second Saturday and at 2:00 P.M. on the Third Sunday of each month. The celebration of the sacraments is an act of the Church; it is never a private celebration. Many people call and request a "private Baptism" which is an oxymoron- no sacrament can ever be private. What they really want is for their child to be baptized by itself and not in a group setting. A Baptism of an individual child is always a rare exception and never the norm; in fact, the ritual really foresees Baptisms to take place during Sunday Mass as the norm and not in a ceremony outside of Mass, which would be an exception. However, the custom of the Baptism ceremony outside of Mass had taken root in our country.

We provided the "private" option during COVID and well beyond its lifting, much longer than many other parishes, to help people feel at ease. But now we will return to the pre-COVID days of Baptisms in a group setting.

Each day, the numbers of our clergy here in the Diocese and throughout the Western world decreases. As our numbers decrease, as we take on the responsibility of more than one parish or job, and as we advance in age we must balance all of our ministerial responsibilities while at the same time taking care of our health. There just are not enough of us to continue in a business-as-usual mode. All of these factors must be taken into consideration as well. Therefore, we will celebrate Baptisms once again, as we did pre-COVID, in a group setting starting in January 2024.

Item 5

January 22- Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. -We usually have all day adoration on this day in reparation for sin of abortion. Due to the church renovations that is not possible this year but please set this day apart spending time in prayer and fasting to end this scourge in our nation and world.

during Sunday mass.


This Week's Readings at Mass

- Jonah 3:1-5, 10 Conversion of Ninevah
- I Corinthians 7:29-31 Encouragement within a hostile world
- Mark 1:14-20 Call of the first disciples

The fishermen who are called by Jesus in this reading knew a life of hardship. They probably could not read or write. They did hard physical labor over long hours to just get by, probably following in the footsteps of their fathers and grandfathers who had always done the same work. When the fishing was good, they could sell the extra fish to provide for their families' needs. When the fish weren't biting, they needed every last one to feed their families. There weren't ways to get ahead in life. They lived under the brutal Roman Empire that occupied their country and ate up extra income with unfair taxes.

Then Jesus came along and invited Simon, Andrew, James, and John to follow him. What is it that made them willing to go without hesitation? They were living a hard life, but at least it was a known life. Joining Jesus to become "fishers of people" would have made no sense at all to most people.

We'll never know the thoughts racing around their minds that day-the day their lives changed in ways they never could have imagined. Up until then they had probably never traveled more than a few unknown future? miles from their All rights reserved. homes. Yet within a few years these four fishermen would be preaching to crowds and baptizing thousands as they traveled throughout their world to tell people about the man who changed their lives. They must have recog-



nized something very special about Jesus to agree to follow him.
