



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

Welcome to the Little Sisters of the Poor who join us this weekend. The Sisters will be in the back of the church after all the Masses seeking donations to help support their ministry to the elderly and poor. Please respond generously to their appeal.

Item 2

Next weekend there will be representatives of the Christians in the Holy Land selling religious items here at the parish. The Christians in the Holy land support themselves by carving sacred images out of olive wood. They suffered greatly during the Covid lockdown due to the lack of tourists visiting the Holy Land. They were beginning to make a comeback, but the war broke out between Hamas and Israel which finds them with much of a livelihood again. They really need our help. Please support them by purchasing the beautiful items they create using their God given talent.

Item 3

Fr. Kieran will return "home to Sacred Heart," next Sunday, February 25^{th,} to celebrate the 10:00 A.M Mass. After Mass, we will have a reception where all will have an opportunity to thank Father Kieran for his ministry among us and wish him well in his new ministry as chaplain at Maimonides Hospital in Brooklyn.

Item 4

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

ABSTINENCE – All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

FASTING – All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on two other occasions during the day.

EASTER DUTY – After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season,

unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time of the year. By special indult, in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this precept has been extended to include the period beginning the First Sunday of Lent (February 18, 2024) to Pentecost (May 19, 2024).

Item 5

NO, that is not a new tabernacle that we have. What you see at the present is the Repository that we usually use on Holy Thursday and which I am temporarily using while the tabernacle has been sent out for minor repair and replanting. Since we have a freshly repainted sanctuary I thought we needed to have a bright, shiny tabernacle too! The last time it was replated was when Msgr. Casey had the church renovated.

Item 6

The painting of the church is almost complete, and the refurbishing of our pews has begun. Please bear with us as this work is in progress. There may be times when certain areas of the church are roped off and you will not be able to sit in your favorite seat- please just be patient with us..... the beauty of the church after all the work is complete will be well worth it!

Item 7

The light fixtures in the church have all been cleaned. This was not part of the original project covered by Generations, However, the fixtures were quite dirty and needed attention. The cost of that project was \$6,800. I also had all the bulbs replaced at the same time and I am awaiting the bill for the bulbs which are all LED bulbs.


This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Genesis 9:8-15 Covenant with Noah
- ▶ 1 Peter 3:18-22 The purpose of Christ's suffering
- ► Mark 1:12-15 Jesus' temptation; the call to conversion

This is the first Sunday of Lent, and we have 40 days stretching ahead of us before Easter. Maybe by now you have settled on some sort of Lenten commitment for the next six weeks. We often think about Lent as a time to give up a bad habit or something that we know isn't good for us, such as coffee, sweets, or alcohol. Traditionally, Catholics are encouraged to commit to something in three areas: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (giving to the poor).

We are encouraged to strengthen our prayer lives. If we have a prayer practice, maybe we can add a little time to it or add in something extra. If we haven't been good at making regular time for prayer, Lent can be the push we need to get a regular practice started. It could be as simple as following a Lenten prayer booklet or online daily retreat program, or getting up a few minutes early to pray and journal.





Also, we are called to fast from something that is unloving, unproductive, or just not good for us and the world community. That might mean fasting from gossip. It could mean fasting from social media that keeps us from connecting in-person in our daily lives. Or maybe it is fasting from buying things we don't need. Finally, with almsgiving, we are called to share our resources with the poor. It is exciting to think of all the good that can come from Lent if we can stick to our promises, and many other people do the same.

Of course there will be temptations. Satan, who tempted Jesus in the desert, doesn't want us to stay faithful to our commitments either, because he knows how much good we can do.
