

Caserta is a nationally known retreat director having led many retreats for priests and religious communities of both men and women throughout the United States, Msgr. Caserta is also a sought out Spiritual Director by many priests. I am certain that Msgr. Caserta's words will inspire us all as we continue on our Lenten journey. Welcome Msgr. Item 2

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

ABSTINENCE – All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain

totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

FASTING – All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full

meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on two other

occasions during the day.

EASTER DUTY – After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the

faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This

precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at

another time of the year. By special indult, in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this precept has been extended to include the period beginning the First Sunday of

Lent (February 18, 2024) to Pentecost (May 19, 2024).

You may still turn in your EASTER NOVENA of MASSES envelopes. Please remember your loved ones—living and deceased—in the Masses that will be said on Easter Sunday and throughout the Octave of Easter. If you submitted this offering online, please send the names of those who you are asking us to We will be remember during the Novena. certain that their names will be placed in the basket along with the envelopes near the altar throughout the Novena. IF you need additional envelopes, please come to the sacristy after Mass or stop by the rectory to pick one up. I ask that all Easter Novena envelopes be returned by WEDNESDAY, MARCH 27TH (Wednesday of HOLY WEEK) prepared to be placed in a basket along with the envelopes near the altar on Easter & throughout the Octave.



# **Bring It into the Light**

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23 Defeat of Judah
- ► Ephesians 2:4-10 Generosity of God's plan
- ▶ John 3:14-21 Jesus' teaching to Nicodemus

-----

In John's Gospel, Jesus teaches often about light and darkness. It is from here that we get the image of Christ as the light of the world, a light that can never be overcome, no matter how deep the darkness of the world might seem at times.

Nicodemus—a Pharisee—comes to Jesus at night, probably because he doesn't want the other Pharisees to see him meeting with Jesus, whom they dislike.

Jesus explains to Nicodemus that

people who are

evil like to
work in the
dark where
their wickedness can
be hidden.
They don't
want to be ex-

posed so they do what they can to hide their actions.

On the other hand, people who are trying to live with honesty, integrity, and truthfulness are not afraid to do their work in the light. They don't feel the need to hide their actions because they have nothing to be afraid of if they are discovered. If we are living in truth, Jesus assures us that we can be confident in letting our works be clearly seen.

This dialogue is an excellent reminder that if we are tempted to keep something secret, we should question our motives. Why do we need to hide our actions or intentions? Is there something we are trying to cover up, and if

Sheepish Question:

Recently, how have I experienced God's grace in spite of my failures?

so, why? St. Ignatius urged people to pay attention to when they were tempted to keep something secret. In such cases, he suggested they intentionally tell someone else about it so as to bring it

into the light.

Are there things you have been tempted to keep hidden or secret? If so, have you also had an experience of allowing something to "come to the light"? How did that bring you freedom or relief?

Share an experience of a time when someone (you or someone else you know) had the courage to bring to light a troubling situation that needed to be addressed. What happened?
