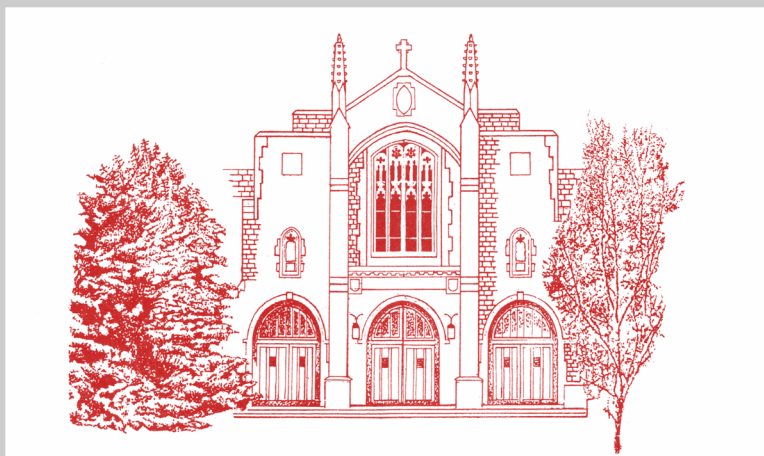

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

A Happy St. Patrick's Day to all our parishioners of Irish ancestry who are celebrating this special day today! A very special greeting to all the Patricks and Patricias who are celebrating their names day.

May the God Lord bless you and keep you in the palm of His hand!

A happy St. Joseph's Day to all our Italian friends and those of other nationalities that celebrate this day with much fanfare (I know that we Polish people do!) A special greeting to all our Josephs and Josephines who are celebrating their names day (*onomastico*).

Item 3

Congratulation to our children from Sacred Heart Catholic Academy and Religious Education Program who made their First Confession last Saturday. May they always know of the merciful and loving encounter with the Lord that is there for them in this great Sacrament. Thank you to the teachers in the Academy and Religious Ed Program, Mrs. Conlan, Mrs. Lyons and the parents for helping prepare the children for this special moment of grace.

Item 4

The celebration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will take place on Saturday, March 23 communally at a Mass which will be celebrated at 12:00 P.M..

The sacrament may be received by those:

- preparing for surgery and, when during the course of recovery, their condition worsens
- struggling with serious or chronic illness
- coping with emotional illness

Item 5

This weekend, March 16 & 17 the second collection is for church flowers and decorations for Holy Week and Easter. All contributions are greatly accepted. However, if your donation is \$30 or more your name and the name of the deceased person or persons in whose memory you made the donation, or the name of the person who gave a gift in someone's name/honor will be printed in a special list in the bulletin after Easter. Thank you in advance for your generous response to this cause. Everyone always remarks that our church is beautifully decorated but beside the time and talent it takes to do so it costs money and things now are even more costly than they were in the past. Please be generous in this collection so that we can give our best to the Lord as we celebrate the great day of His Resurrection.

Item 6

A note of explanation/clarification--- In your envelope packet there is an envelope that says EASTER GIFT. This collection will be taken up on Palm Sunday, March 24. This envelope is for your extraordinary or special gift to your parish at Easter. There is also an envelope that says EASTER OFFERING with the date March 31- Easter Sunday. This envelope is for your regular Sunday offering to the parish. This is NOT a mistake; they are for two different collections on two different days.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 7

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

ABSTINENCE – All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

FASTING – All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on two other occasions during the day. **EASTER DUTY** – After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time of the year. By special indult, in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this precept has been extended to include the period beginning the First Sunday of Lent (February 18, 2024) to Pentecost (May 19, 2024).

Item 8

You may still turn in your **EASTER NOVENA** of **MASSES** envelopes. Please remember your loved ones- living and deceased- in the Masses that will be said on Easter Sunday and throughout the Octave of Easter. If you submitted this offering online, please send the names of those who are asking us to remember during the Novena. We will be certain that their names will be placed in the basket along with the envelopes near the altar throughout the Novena. If you need additional envelopes, please come to the sacristy after Mass or stop by the rectory to pick one up. I ask that all Easter Novena envelopes be returned by **WEDNESDAY, MARCH 27th** (WEDNESDAY of **HOLY WEEK**) prepared to be placed in a basket that will be near the altar on Easter and throughout the Octave.

Item 9

The installation of the shrine, reliquary and statue of Blessed Carlo Acutis has begun; there are still some minor bits of work to do to complete the shrine which I am told will be completed in the early part of Holy Week. The shrine is located to the right of the tabernacle. Recall that when the relic arrived in our Diocese Bishop DiMarzio stated that our parish would become the Diocesan shrine of Blessed Carlo. Bishop Brennan confirmed that in a conversation with me shortly after his installation as our Bishop. When it is completed and statutes for the shrine are composed and approved I will ask the Bishop to come and bless and dedicate the Diocesan Shrine of Blessed Carlo at Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish.

Item 13

ACA 2024 HAS BEGUN!

Our goal is the same as last year- \$91,954.00.

41 parishioners have already responded to the 2024 ACA and pledged \$51,670.00 and paid \$48,735.00.- that is more than ½ our goal paid! Of Course, as in the past, we are where we are because one parishioner made a pledge of \$30,000 and paid the pledge in one payment for which, I am, as always, very grateful. to that parishioner and those who have made a pledge thus far. Last year, because of your generosity we were almost \$27,000 over goal. We received that money back and I was able to apply that to one of the large annual bills I receive from the Diocese – our Assessment Bill which is \$60,500. What we received back paid off almost half of that bill! We would have been in even better shape if everyone had paid off their pledges- there were a number of pledges- 10 which went unfulfilled which amounted to almost another \$27,000. I understand that circumstances change unexpectedly sometimes in life that are not in our control. Nonetheless, I am so grateful for the \$27,000 we went over goal.

Again, many thanks to those who have already participated in ACA 2024 by making a pledge. If you have never made a pledge before to the ACA please consider making this year, the first year, you participate and make a pledge.

117 parishioners and friends have contributed to the appeal regarding the installation of the new A/C system, the fence around the parking lot and the eventual installation of the security cameras., thus far donating \$107,075.00. Farmers Can Understand

This Week's Readings at Mass

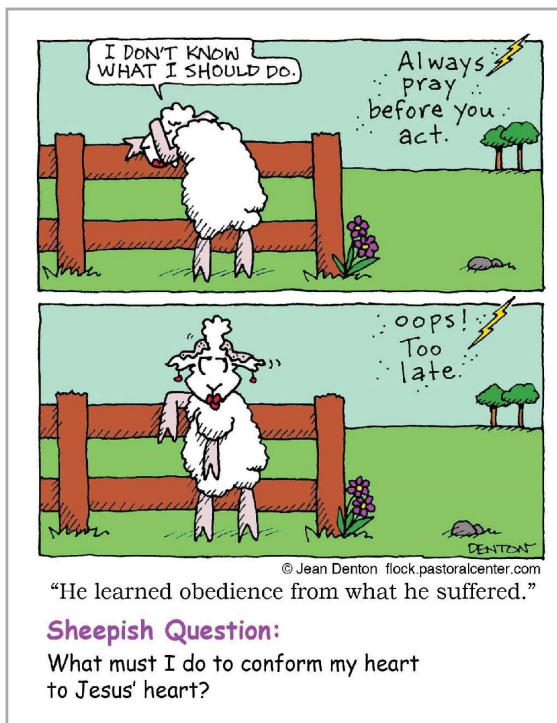
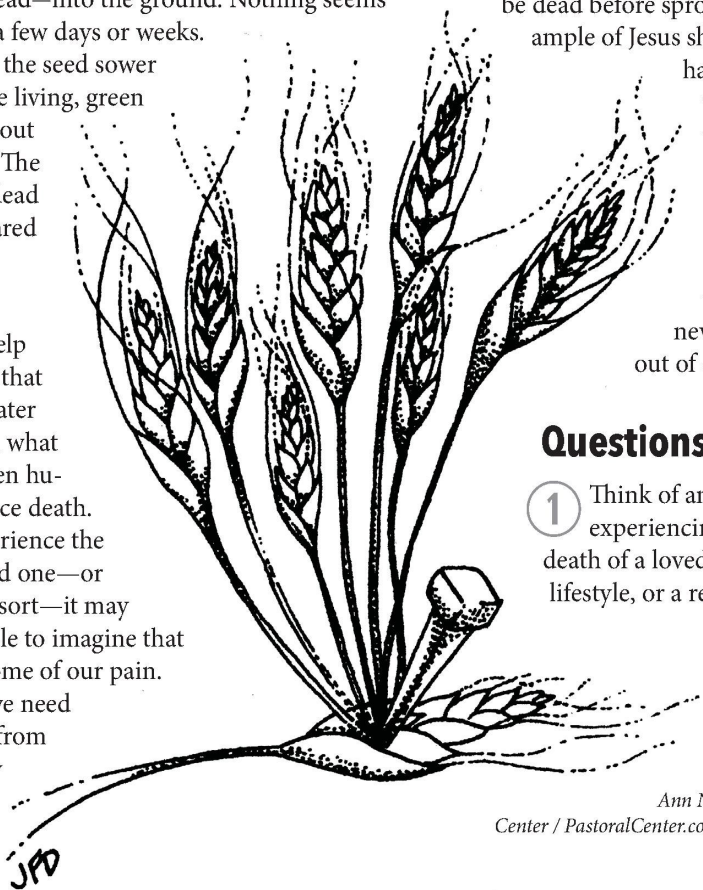
- ▶ Jeremiah 31:31-34 - The new covenant
- ▶ Hebrews 5:7-9 - Jesus, compassionate high priest
- ▶ John 12:20-33 - A grain of wheat must die

In Jesus' day and time, almost everyone who heard him would have had farming experience, or at least been exposed to the farming life. It meant that Jesus could use examples and images from agriculture that would be easy for most people to understand. He does this in today's gospel reading when he reminds his listeners that "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit" (Jn 12:24).

For those of us in today's world who haven't had the experience of planting seeds, we have missed out on this amazing miracle. A person plants seeds—which appear to be dead—into the ground. Nothing seems to happen for a few days or weeks.

Then, one day, the seed sower wakes up to see living, green shoots poking out of the ground. The seeds weren't dead like they appeared to be.

Jesus uses this metaphor to help us understand that something greater is at work than what we can see when humans experience death. When we experience the death of a loved one—or a death of any sort—it may seem impossible to imagine that new life can come of our pain. That is when we need this reminder from Jesus. Not only do we know that seeds appear to



be dead before sprouting again, we have the example of Jesus showing us that death does *not* have the final say. We may not want to let someone or something in our life go, but we can do so in an act of faith. We can choose to act in faith and to act despite our feelings of pain and hopelessness, trusting that God can bring new life in some unforeseen way out of death.

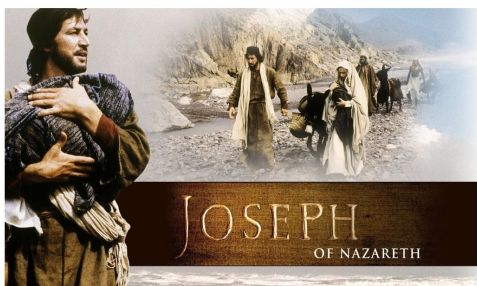

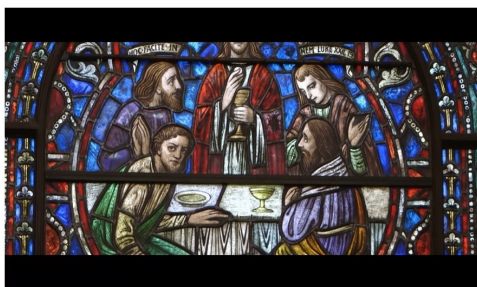

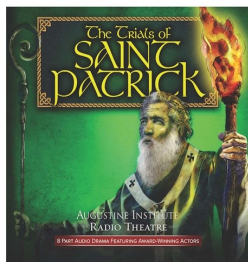
