






#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### Item 1

As we enter the holiest week of the year let us take time to quiet down and meditate on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord. Plan to participate in the liturgies of Holy Week. I was once asked: Why are these special days-Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturdaynot Holydays of Obligation? I do not have any official answer to that question, but I think that perhaps the reason is that the Church wants us participate in these days, not out of obligation but out of a sense of love. Make some time on Holy Thursday evening to come and pray before the Altar of Repose and keep vigil with Our Lord. On Good Friday stop and think of what Our Lord suffered for us- to set us free from sin and the power of death! Do we really appreciate that? Turn off the iPhone, computer, TV for an hour and just sit in quiet and meditate on Jesus' sacrifice. Bring your Easter food and treats to be blessed on Holv Saturday. Make the center of your Easter Sunday the Mass. Make this week a truly HOLY week so that, come Easter, you may experience the joy of the Risen Lord like you never have before.

#### Item 4

This Monday, March 25<sup>th</sup> is RECONCILIATION MONDAY- All Churches in the Archdiocese of New York, The diocese of Brooklyn and the Diocese of Rockville Centre will have a priest(s) available to celebrate the sacrament with you from 2:00 P.M.-4:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M.-9:00 P.M. Please do not let Lent go by without going to confession. Prepare your heart to celebrate the great feast of the Lord's Resurrection by seeking God's mercy and forgiveness.

#### Item 5

You may still donate toward the expense associated with the purchasing of church flowers and decorations for Holy Week and Easter. All contributions are greatly accepted. However, if your donation is \$30 or more your name and the name of the deceased person or persons in whose memory you made the donation, or the name of the person who gave a gift someone's name/honor will be printed in a special list in the bulletin after Easter. Thank you in advance for your generous response to this cause. Everyone always remarks that our church is beautifully decorated but beside the time and talent it takes to do so it costs money and things now are even more costly than they were in the past. Please be generous in this collection so that we can give our best to the Lord as we celebrate the great day of His Resurrection.

#### Item 6

A note of explanation/clarification--- In your envelope packet there is an envelope that says EASTER GIFT. This collection will be taken up today-Palm Sunday, March 24. This envelope is for your extraordinary or special gift to your parish at Easter. There is also an envelope that says EASTER OFFERING with the date March 31 - Easter Sunday. This envelope is for your regu-

lar Sunday offering to the parish. This is NOT a mistake; they are for two different collections on two different days.

#### Item 8

#### **LENTEN REGULATIONS:**

ABSTINENCE – All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

FASTING – All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on two other occasions during the day.

EASTER DUTY – After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time of the year. By special indult, in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this precept has been extended to include the period beginning the First Sunday of Lent (February 18, 2024) to Pentecost (May 19, 2024).

#### Item 9

You may still turn in your EASTER NOVENA of MASSES envelopes. Please remember your loved ones- living and deceased- in the Mases that will be said on Easter Sunday and throughout the Octave of Easter. If you submitted this offering online, please send the names of those ACA 2024 HAS BEGUN! who are asking us to remember during the Novena. We will be certain that their names will be placed in the basket along with the envelopes near the altar throughout the Novena. If you need additional envelopes, please come to the sacristy after Mass or stop by the rectory to pick one up. I ask that all Easter Novena envelopes be returned by WEDNESDAY, MARCH 27th (WEDNESDAY of HOLY WEEK) prepared to be placed in a basket that will be near the altar on Easter and throughout the Octave.

THERE WILL NOT BE A HOLY HOUR ON HOLY THURSDAY OR ON THURDAY OF EASTER WEEK. WE WILL RESUME THE HOLY HOURS AS SOON AS ALL THE WOK IN THE CHURCH IS COMPLETE.

April 29-30-May 1. ON APRIL 29 and 30 we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacramentpray the Rosary- pray the Litany to St. Peregrine- a brief reflection-Benediction and blessing with the Relic of St. Peregrine.

On May 1, The Most Reverend Nicholas DiMarzio, Bishop Emeritus of Brooklyn will celebrate Mass during which we will also administer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick especially for those who are suffering from cancer.

You may also come to pray for those who have lost their lives to this dreaded disease during these days as well. There will be a bulletin board

set up where you can pin a picture of someone who has died from cancer. A basket in which you can place the names of those for whom you would like us to pray during these days will be placed in front of the altar. Please plan to join us in prayer on these days and invite your family, friends, and neighbors to join us too!

#### Item 12

Our goal is the same as last year-\$91,954.00. 47 parishioners have already responded to the 2024 ACA and pledged \$53,250.00 and paid \$48,735.00.- that is more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  our goal paid! Of Course, as in the past, we are where we are because one parishioner made a pledge of \$30,000 and paid the pledge in one payment for which, I am, as always, very grateful to that parishioner and those who have made a pledge thus far. Last year, because of your generosity we were almost \$27,000 over goal. We received that money back and I was able to apply that to one of the large annual bills I receive from the Diocese - our Assessment Bill which is \$60,500. What we received back paid off almost half of that bill! We would have been in even better shape if everyone had paid off their pledgesthere were a number of pledges- 10 which went unfulfilled which amounted to almost another \$27,000. I understand that circumstances change unexpectedly sometimes in life that are not in our control. Nonetheless, I am so grateful for the \$27,000 we went over goal.

Again, many thanks to those who have already participated in ACA 2024 by making a pledge. If you have never made a pledge before to the ACA please consider making this year, the first year, you participate and make a pledge.

## **Not Wearing a Costume**

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Mark 11:1-10 Welcomed with palms
- ▶ Isaiah 50:4-7 The suffering servant
- ► Philippians 2:6-11 Jesus, compassionate high priest
- ► Mark 14:1-15:47 The passion of Jesus

Each Gospel writer tells the story of Jesus' passion and death slightly differently, emphasizing particular aspects of Jesus that each especially wants future generations to remember. Mark's gospel makes it very clear that Jesus suffered intensely, and that he experienced deep human emo-

tions. Mark does not want us to think that Jesus was God just dressed up in a human costume who didn't really suffer when the nails were hammered into his hands and feet. No, Jesus was just like one of us in his experience of pain and despair, even to the point of wondering why God had abandoned him. Looking back on Jesus' death, Christians don't believe that God abandoned Jesus. We can see now how God brought him through death into new life. Yet Jesus felt abandoned just before he died. This point can remind us that our

feelings do not make up all of reality. If we feel despairing or hopeless or that all is lost, we can remember that Jesus felt the same. If we are terrified of death, or we can't feel any sense of God's presence with us in our suffering, we can be assured that God has not abandoned us, just as God did not abandon Jesus. Sometimes all that can be done is to stay the course, remembering that God found a way to bring life out of death, even when Jesus and the others around him could not see it in the moment.

### Questions of the Week

Have you ever felt abandoned by God? Looking back on that time now, do you have a sense of how God was still present and active then? How?

Think of people in your life now who are suffering or despairing for any reason. How might you make yourself available to them so that they will know they are not alone?
