PERSONALIZING THE FUNERAL HOME SETTING

This is your time to say farewell to your loved one. Therefore, the funeral home setting should be as comfortable as possible. May we offer the following suggestions:

Music is soothing. Perhaps a favorite music tape can be playing softly in the background.

Letters of goodbye can be written and placed in the casket; small children can substitute a drawing.

Some families set a "memory table" with photographs, tools of a trade, special awards or other memorabilia.

THE VIGIL SERVICE

The vigil service takes place the day/evening before the funeral mass. This gathering of friends and family provides the perfect opportunity for sharing memories of the deceased. Together with prayer and story telling, the spirit of your loved one lives on in all who are present.

EULOGY: A family member or friend may speak in remembrance of the deceased at the mass before the final commendation.

THE FUNERAL MASS

Family members and friends are invited to take part in the Mass of Christian Burial. They may participate by:

CHOOSING THE MUSIC: Please use the PLANNING SHEET listings of appropriate hymns as a reference for selections: Entrance, Responsorial Psalm, Offertory, Communion and Recessional.

CHOOSING THE SCRIPTURE: Please review the sourcebook *Through Death to Life.* For the first reading choose from the **Old Testament (p 26-34).** For the second reading choose from the **New Testament (p 45-55).** The **Responsorial Psalm (p 35-44)** will be sung between the Old and New Testament readings. Two optional OT and two optional NT readings are also included in this pamphlet. The **Gospel reading (p 59-78)** and *prayers of the mass* will normally be chosen by the priest. However, if you have a favorite gospel passage, please cite it.

MINISTERING AS READER: You may invite a friend or family member to proclaim the scripture passages or we will provide a lector to do so. The priest celebrant proclaims the gospel.

PLACING THE WHITE PALL OVER THE CASKET: As the procession enters the church, the casket is blessed with holy water and draped with a large white cloth called the pall. The pall reminds us of our baptismal garment, the "outward sign" of our Christian dignity. Two or more family members or friends may drape the pall over the casket as one final gesture of love and devotion.

PRESENTING THE GIFTS AT THE OFFERTORY: Family members or friends may bring the bread and wine in procession to the altar.




