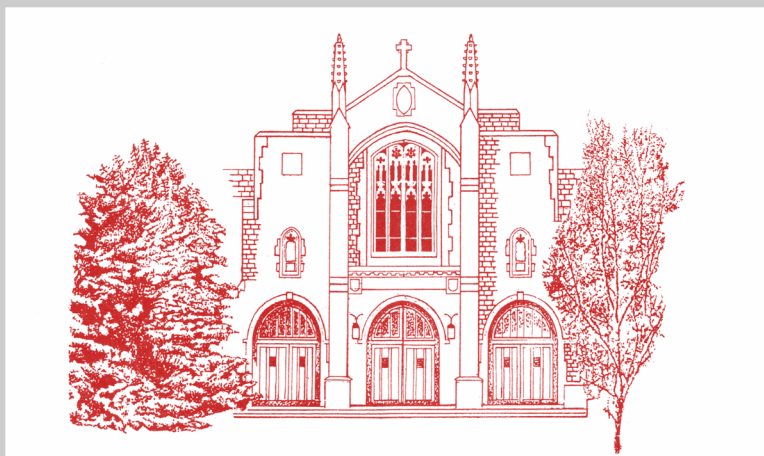

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

EASTER DUTY – After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time of the year. By special indult, in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this precept has been extended to include the period beginning the First Sunday of Lent (February 18, 2024) to Pentecost (May 19, 2024).

April 29-30-May 1- TRIDUUM to ST. PEREGRINE- PATRON SAINT of THOSE WITH CANCER- April 29-30-May 1. ON APRIL 29 and 30 we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament- pray the Rosary- pray the Litany to St. Peregrine- a brief reflection-Benediction and blessing with the Relic of St. Peregrine. On Monday, April 29 our guest homilist will be The Very Reverend Joseph G. Fonti, V.F., Director of the Office of Priestly Life and Ministry, Dean of Deanery Queens 4 and Pastor of St. Mel's, Flushing. On Tuesday, April 30, our homilist will be The Very Reverend John J. Costello, V. E., Regional Episcopal Vicar of Queens East and Pastor of St. Luke's, Whitestone. On May 1, The Most Reverend Nicholas DiMarzio, Bishop Emeritus of Brooklyn will celebrate Mass during which we will also administer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick especially for those who are suffering from cancer.

You may also come to pray for those who have lost their lives to this dreaded disease during these days as well. There will be a bulletin board set up where you can pin a picture of someone who has died from cancer. A basket in which you can place the names of those for whom you would like us to pray during these days will be placed in front of the altar. Please plan to join us in prayer on these days and invite your family, friends, and neighbors to join us too!

CLOW MASS

*"Sometimes, moreover, if the place itself and the nature of the community permit, it will be appropriate to celebrate the **Liturgy of the Word**, including a homily, with the children in a separate, but not too distant room. Then, before the **Eucharistic Liturgy** begins, the children are led to the place where the adults have meanwhile celebrated their own liturgy of the word."*

The above permission, which appeared in 1973, lies behind a phenomenon which has emerged in many Catholic parishes over the past few years, namely the celebration of a separate **Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)** during Sunday mass.

During mass, after the opening prayer, children Pre-K through 6th grade, are invited to go to the church hall to hear the readings of the day proclaimed and explained in age appropriate language. 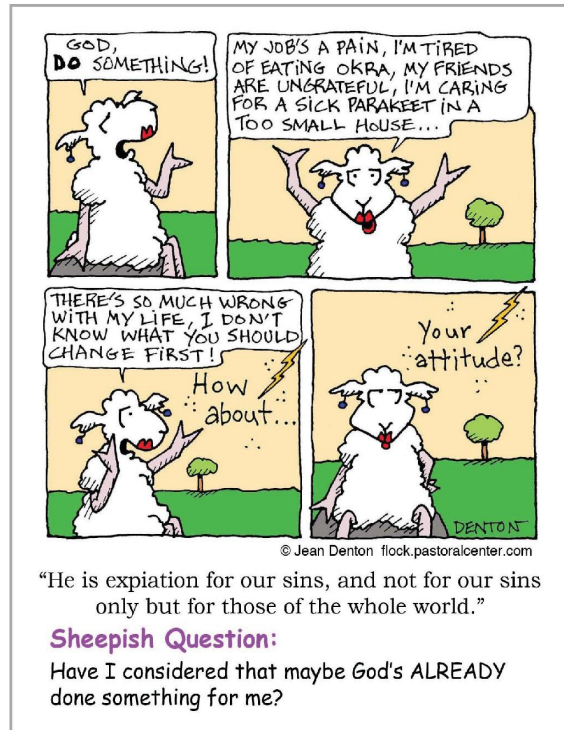
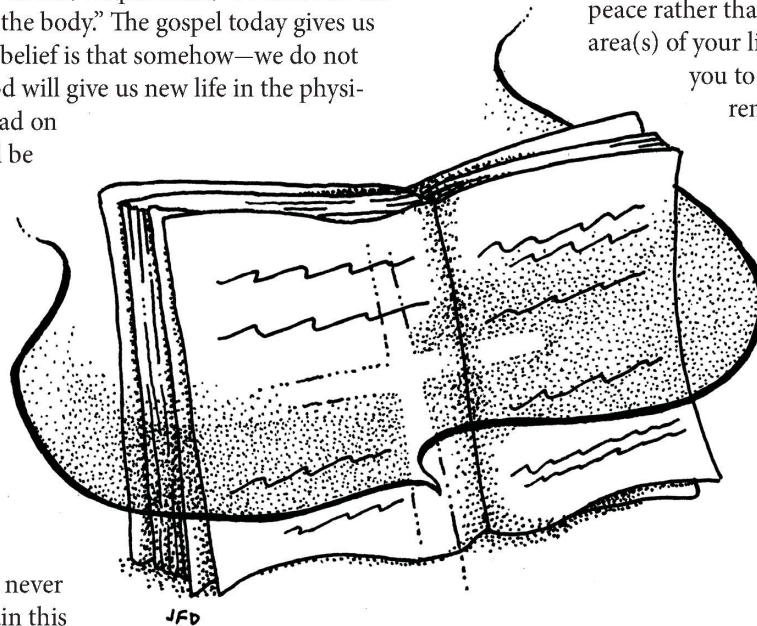
This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Acts 3:13-15, 17-19 - Peter's speech on Jesus' resurrection
- ▶ 1 John 2:1-5a - Keeping the commandments
- ▶ Luke 24:35-48 - Jesus appears to the Eleven

Just like last week, we get another reminder that the risen Jesus offers peace to his friends and disciples. In this reading, they are still struggling with fear, doubt, and confusion about what they have experienced over the last three days. Rather than criticizing them for their doubts or misunderstandings, Jesus begins this encounter with them with his famous words "Peace be with you." Before he does anything else, he wants them to have that gift. Once the peace is given, *then* he can answer their questions. It is only after they receive his peace that they can come to believe that this person in front of them—whom they thought was a ghost—is really their risen friend.

Jesus takes care to show the disciples that he is still in a physical body. They can feel him with their own fingers. They can see the nail wounds in his hands and feet. They watch him eating fish. Jesus wants to be clear with them that he is not just a bright spirit floating around the earth.

In the Apostles' Creed, we proclaim, "I believe in the resurrection of the body." The gospel today gives us that hope. Our belief is that somehow—we do not know how—God will give us new life in the physical bodies we had on earth. They will be recognizable, as Jesus was recognizable after his resurrection, and they will still show the marks of our wounds, but those wounds will be healed. We will never be able to explain this



hope and this belief with our minds, but then again, neither could the disciples have explained it rationally to others.

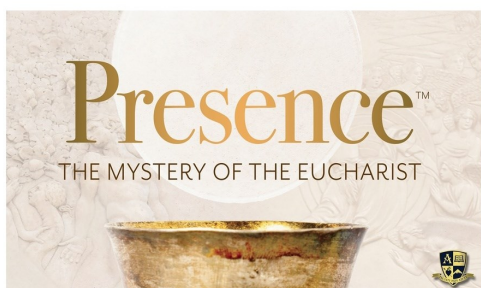
Questions of the Week
