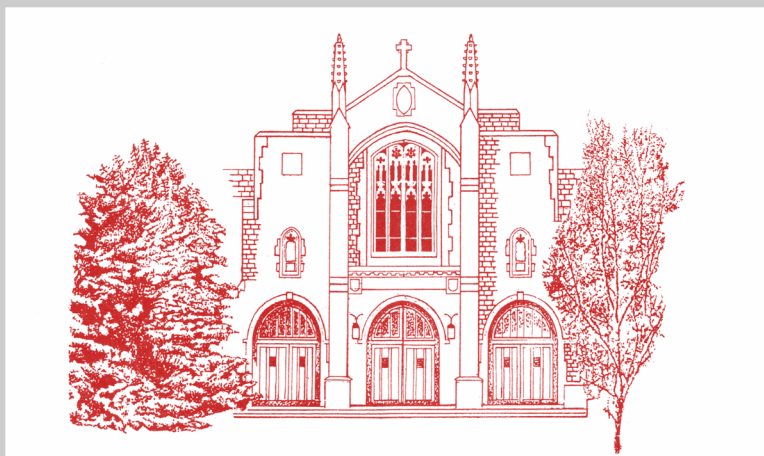

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Item 1

O, Sacrament Most Holy! O, Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment thine!

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ or as it is more traditionally known the Feast of Corpus Christi. It is a day that should cause us to pause and ask ourselves if we genuinely appreciate the great gift of the Eucharist. Do we truly understand that this is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ that we receive? It is NOT just a symbol it IS truly the BODY of CHRIST! Does my behavior in Church show that I know that I am in the presence of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity? Do I genuflect (if I am able to) or profoundly bow upon entering the church and exiting the church? Do I fast for one hour from all food (this includes gum, hard candy, TicTacs, etc.) before receiving Holy Communion? Do I exit the Church immediately after receiving Communion? Do I spend a moment in thanksgiving at the conclusion of Mass thanking Jesus for giving Himself to me or do I run for the door as quickly as possible? Do I wait to carry on my conversations with others until I reach the vestibule of the church so that a quiet atmosphere of prayer is maintained in the church? Am I conscious of my mode of dress when attending Mass on Sundays? (we follow dress codes for restaurants and other venues why not for Church?)

It is sad to read articles that state that 70% of baptized Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist but see it as only a symbol. Let us give honor to Our Lord in the Eucharist on this day and always! O, Sacrament Most Holy! O, Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment thine!

Pray that the Eucharistic Revival in our nation and the upcoming National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis will awaken a sense of reverence and awe in all believers that it is really **JESUS- BODY- BLOOD -SOUL and DIVINITY** present in the Eucharist. It is not a symbol! It is not just a piece of bread and cup of wine! **IT IS THE LORD!**

The above permission, which appeared in 1973, led behind a phenomenon which has emerged in many Catholic parishes over the past few years, namely the celebration of a separate Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) during Sunday Mass.

During mass, after the opening prayer, children Pre-K through 6th grade, are invited to go to the church hall to hear the reading of the day proclaimed and explained in age appropriate language. The children rejoin their families during the preparation of the gifts at the offertory. Younger children are often accompanied by their parents.

Blood and Sacrifice

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Exodus 24:3-8 - Ratification of the covenant
- ▶ Hebrews 9:11-15 - The sacrifice of Jesus
- ▶ Mark 14:12-16, 22-26 - Passover preparation

The church celebrates the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ today with three readings about blood, sacrifices, and covenants. The first reading re-tells the story of Moses using the blood of young bulls to symbolically seal the covenant between the Israelites and God after God gave them the Ten Commandments on Mt. Sinai. The Letter to the Hebrews declares that Jesus' sacrifice is more effective than the blood of goats and bulls in sanctifying us. Finally, Jesus' words at the Last Supper reveal a new understanding—that Jesus will take the place of animals in Jewish worship by offering himself up to death for us.

Jesus' Last Supper was a Passover supper. It took place on the day that Jews traditionally sacrificed and ate a lamb in remembrance of the night when God "passed over" the houses of the Israelites.

On that night in Egypt, following Moses' instructions, each Israelite family sacrificed a lamb and used its blood to mark their door posts. That same night, the firstborn of all the Egyptians were killed, but death passed over the Israelites, and they followed Moses to freedom through the parted waters of the Red Sea. The Passover supper included a ritual of breaking and sharing unleavened bread (which is why the bread we use for Communion is unleavened) and sharing wine together.

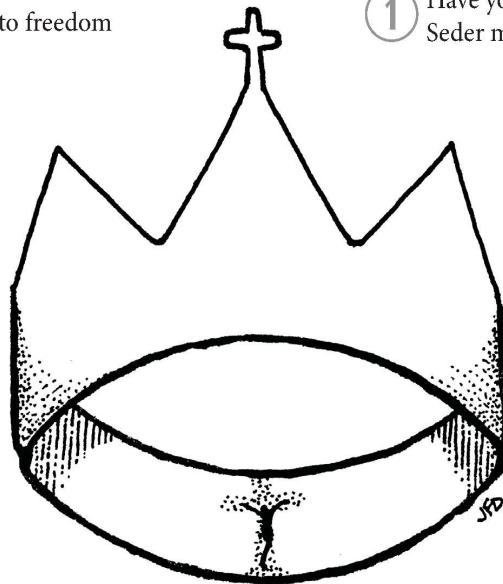
When Jesus and the disciples shared their Passover meal they were following all of the Jewish traditions. What made that particular Passover meal differ-



ent was that Jesus declared that the bread they were eating was his body and the wine they drank was his blood, the "blood of the covenant." From then on, the Passover supper became a remembrance both of how God freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and how Jesus saves us by showing us how to live and die.

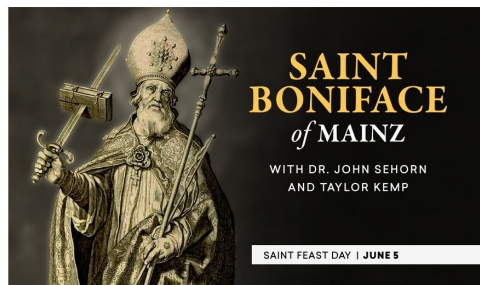
