



Item 1

We welcome Msgr. Thomas Caserta to our parish this weekend. Msgr. Caserta will preach at the Saturday evening Mass and the 8 AM and 10 Am Masses (due to a previous commitment he cannot preach at the 12 Noon Mass, but you can listen to his homily from the other Masses on the livestream recordings) on the enthronement of the Sacred Heart in the homes of our families and devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, our parish Patron. On the feast of Christ the King, November 24th, those families who sign up and request a picture of the Sacred Heart will be invited to come forward and receive their picture which they will enthrone in their home, dedicating themselves and their family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Holy Hour consists of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, praying the Rosary, quiet time for silent prayer and meditation and Benediction. Come, worship the Lord!

Item 3

October is the Month of the Holy Rosary. Please try to say at least a decade of the Rosary every day of the month. Try to say the Rosary as a family each day. Pray for peace in the world, in our country, in our city, in our families. Pray for vocations to the Priesthood and Consecrated Life. The Rosary is a powerful weapon against the forces of evil- the devil hates the Rosary. St. Pope John Paul II called it his favorite prayer. Blessed Carlo Acuits called it the shortest ladder to heaven. So many saints throughout the ages attested to its power. Our goal is the same as last year-\$91,954.00. As of October 15th, 189 parishioners have already responded to the 2024 ACA and pledged \$130,454.00

A few weeks ago, we received our first disbursement of money-\$8.065.50 that comes back to us because we are OVER-GOAL.



To Serve of Be Served?

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Isaiah 53:10-11 The suffering servant
- ► Hebrews 4:14-16 Jesus, compassionate high priest
- ► Mark 10:35-45 Ambition of James and John

Mark's Gospel, more than any of the other three Gospels, paints a picture of the twelve apostles as a bumbling, immature group that keeps getting things wrong, misunderstanding their teacher, and arguing amongst themselves.

The passage today follows immediately after Jesus' third prediction of his upcoming death. How do the disciples respond? James and John change the subject and ask for a special favor—they each want a position of honor when Jesus comes into his glory.

As usual, Jesus turns their thinking upside down. Now is not the time to talk about glory. Now is the time to be realistic about how the world treats people who speak up for justice and work for peace. The Old Testament was clear that prophets who spoke truth to power were often killed. Jesus realizes his apostles will face similar opposition, and he asks them if they are willing to risk such suffering. As readers, we get the feeling James and John don't know what they are committing themselves to when they say they can

drink the same cup as Jesus. They just want to get to the glory.


It is not surprising that the other disciples get upset with James' and John's power-grab, and their anger leads to yet another lesson by Jesus about the alternative nature of God's kingdom. Jesus raises up the position of lowly servants and demotes the rulers. He puts the slave first and the first last. He is clear that rather than racing to the top, the apostles should be humbling themselves to serve.
